The Child Safeguarding Statement (CSS) is developed in line with requirements under Co-operating to Safeguard Children and Young People in Northern Ireland (2017) and the NI Safeguarding Children in Sport Standards (2020) in Northern Ireland and Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare of Children, Tusla's Child Safeguarding: A Guide for Policy, Procedure and Practice, current legislation such as the Children First Act 2015, Child Care Act 1991, Protections for Persons Reporting Child Abuse Act 1998 and the National Vetting Bureau Act 2012 in the Republic of Ireland. Our guiding principles are underpinned by the Swim Ireland Safeguarding Policies, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and current legislation relevant to safeguarding children in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

Our guiding principles apply to all paid staff, volunteers, committee members and any other person appointed to work within our region, who must sign up to and abide by these guiding principles and our child safeguarding procedures.

We will review our guiding principles and child safeguarding procedures every two years or sooner, if necessary, due to organisational issues or changes in legislation or national policy.
